


WORLD MASTERS ASSOCIATION CROSS COUNTRY SKIING AUSTRALIAN ANNUAL REPORT 2024-25

June-September 2024: Winter in Oz

 For the many northern hemisphere Masters XC skiers who ask, yes, we do have lots of snow in winter, and mountain ranges up to 2,228m in Australia! Our main XC (and downhill) ski resorts are at Falls Creek, Victoria (1,500m to 1,780m) and Perisher Valley, New South Wales (1,720m to 2,054m). There is also lots of National Park backcountry available for XC ski touring and mountaineering.



- Australia provides great opportunities for Masters XC skiers from the northern hemisphere to get some off-season ski training 'down under'. Most winters we see European, US, Malaysian, Korean and Japanese athletes coming down to train on our trails. - The 2024 ski season had good snowfalls in our XC ski resorts in New South Wales (see Perisher photo below) and Victoria. Lots of events and races were successfully held through the season. Perisher XC Race Week 3-11 August was a highlight.

August 2024: Kangaroo Hoppet, Australia

• Unfortunately, it again warmed up too quickly at the end of the season and the *Worldloppet* Kangaroo Hoppet race on 24 Aug 2023 had to be cancelled for the second year in a row.

August 2024: Ushuaia Loppet, Argentina

 Masters skier Allan Hope was the only Australian to enter in the 42km Ushuaia Loppet on 18 August 2024, finishing 28th in the men's open (no age categories recorded). Race results can be found at <u>Ushuaia Loppet Results</u>.



- Allan reported that there are two ski fields to know about.
 Tierra Mayor is where the race starts and finishes. There is a
 restaurant, car park and basics. Up the road a bit is Cerro
 Castor, a downhill ski resort. It is at the eastern end of the
 main 20km race loop, with plenty of facilities including storage
 lockers. It is the best part of the race loop.
- The race loop can be divided into two parts, east of the start at Tierra Mayor is mainly sheltered by forest and is good skiing. There is a steep hill (wall) going east and then a turn around when you get to the chair lifts at Cerro Castor. There are two tunnels to go through, and when you get back to the start / finish area you are out in the open
- Once in the open on the second part of the course there is no forest to protect you from the wind (there was plenty of it).
 This area is flat with lots of frozen ponds which made for interesting skiing, especially when the wind blew the snow off

- the icy ponds. He recommends that the race is worth doing while you still can.
- Unfortunately, the 2025 Ushuaia Loppet has been cancelled due to logistics and sponsorship issues. They plan to run the event again in 2026. If you are interested in entering, then Allan is happy to share travel, accommodation and other information about his 12 day trip to Argentina. 8-16 March 2025 - MWC Klosters, Switzerland

- In March a team of 28 Australian Masters skiers and supporters participated in the Masters World Cup 2025, in Klosters, Switzerland. The Masters World Cup is an annual competition for skiers over the age of 30, coordinated by the World Masters Association and endorsed by FIS. Team camaraderie was fantastic and there were some great results in variable snow conditions. All the results can be found at Masters World Cup 2025 Results. A special well done goes to the Masters skiers who competed in their first ever races at a Masters World Cup.

After a rest day and some fresh snow falls, the courses were looking good for the 4 x 5km relays (2 laps CT followed by 2 laps FT). Australia had two teams, one in the Men's 07 (6064yo) age group and the other in the Men's 09 (70-74yo), both age groups with many highly competitive national relay teams. The home team, Switzerland, won both age groups. For Australia, in the M07 age group Bruce Donnan, Lindsay Bridgford, David Simpson and Wayne Pethybridge finished 10th, and in the M09 age group Adrian Blake, Andrew Walker, Len Budge and Bob Flower finished 7th. Aussie! Aussie! Aussie!

- The final day of competition had the long-distance courses. Jane Scheer and Irene Dunn competed in the 30km FT event, finishing with the great results of 5th and 11th respectively. In the 20km FT, the Australian competitors were Susan Donoghue, Robert Dunn, Wayne Pethybridge, David Simpson,
 - Zac Zaharias, Bob Flowers, Len Budge, Adrian Blake and Peter Macartney. More excellent results with Wayne Pethybridge coming in 18th, Robert Dunn 42nd, and Bob Flower 19th. Susan Donoghue, Catherine Lambert, Bruce Donnan, Andrew Walker and Peter Macartney competed in the 20km CT race, with Andrew Walker 13th and Bruce Donnan 28th grabbing WMA points.

- In Masters cross-country skiing as well, the Australian team is highly competitive with the British team, if not the rest of Europe. In the style of a cricket tragic, Friedl Bartsch created the Mount Kosciusko Alpine Ashes AUS vs GBR Masters World Cup XC Skiing trophy (pictured below).
- The Ashes were initially won by Australia at MWC 2019 in Beitostoelen, Norway, and were retained by Australia until MWC2024 in Vuokatti, Finland. GBR won the trophy by a whisker at MWC2024. Australia reclaimed the trophy at MWC2025 in Klosters, Switzerland! We will continue with Freidl's legacy and compete for this trophy at future MWC...
